This term we will start by exploring a persuasive advert with focus on being ecofriendly, specifically alternatives to plastic straws.

French

We will be revising classroom instructions before learning how to describe themselves.



This term we will be revisiting and building on our learning in number. will be covering place value, addition, subtraction, multiplication and division.

Pupils are expected to know all of their times tables, up to 12x12 by the end of year 4 so this is a big focus too.

This term we are learning about electricity including common electrical appliances and how to construct simple series circuits. Children will learn about cells, wires, bulbs and buzzers and about the different types of switches. The children will also learn about conductors and insulators and know that metals are very good electrical conductors.

Following this we are expanding on learning from year 3 about how animals, including humans, and how need to get nutrition from what they eat. They will explore the different organs of the digestive system in humans and the functions of teeth in both humans and animals.

In Art, the children will explore how we can create sequenced imagery to share and tell stories.

In Design and Technology, pupils will be creating their own torches, linked to their Science learning and then making a slingshot car.

History


Music

We will be answering the question: Why are rainforests important to us? Pupils will be learning about biomes, the layers of the rainforest, explore plant adaptations, study the Amazon rainforest and evaluate the impact humans are having on the Amazon and an action that can be taken to help.

In History, the class will be exploring how the achievements of the Ancient Maya impact their society and beyond. The children will explore the achievements of ancient peoples like the Maya by investigating historical and archaeological evidence. Through the observation and analysis of artefacts, children scrutinise their settlement strategies in rainforests, the cultural significance of chocolate and the impact of their beliefs, inventions and decline within and beyond their society.

Poplar will be exploring the rainforest through music and be introduced to new musical terms. They will also use a mixture of body percussion and tuned percussion instruments as the children create their own rhythms of the rainforest, layer by layer.

Computing

Our PSHCE lessons begin with work on Health and Wellbeing by looking at Aspirations before moving on to Emotions. We will also explore our school values for the Autumn term: Kindness and Cooperation, Thankfulness, Friendship and Sharing, Respect. During this term, year 4 start by looking at online safety where they will learn about preventing and dealing with cyberbullying; how to use search engines efficiently; how to avoid plagiarism online; and how to be a good digital citizen.

They will then be improving their word processing skills on Microsoft Word. They will learn about formatting images and organising content into and effective layout.

In PE we will be starting with outdoor orienteering where the children will be building on team skills as well as directional and map skills.

They will then move on to dodgeball where pupils will improve on key skills used in dodgeball such as throwing, dodging and catching.

RE

RE will begin with exploring the question: Where, how and why do people worship? Looking across a range of faiths.

They will then focus on Islam exploring: How do festivals and worship show what matters to Muslims?
